Dear Mr. Saltzman:

In order that you may be fully informed of my negotiation with the Passport Division, Department of State, concerning your passport, I am enclosing herewith copy of a letter dated June 10th, addressed to the Passport Division.

Please advise me whether you received the endorsement for Palestine and necessary countries enroute.

Mr. Nicholas promised to call the Passport Control Office at Rockefeller Center in view of the fact that you are about to leave. When the telephone charges are received, I will pay them and will request your organization to reimburse me which I am sure it will do.

Concerning Mr. Kahn's passport application, for the time being action thereon has been suspended. However, about four or six weeks before he commences his journey, a letter should be addressed to the Passport Division by your organization to the effect that Mr. Kahn's mission is a different one from yours. I believe that by that time the situation will be different and Mr. Kahn should have no difficulty in obtaining passport.
