Dear Mr. Kahn:

The American Jewish Congress is reviewing its relationships with its affiliated organizations in order to establish those affiliations on a consistent and uniform basis. Those relationships obviously must include such problems as the payment of affiliation dues on a fixed and adequate scale, representation of affiliated groups on the Executive and Administrative Committees and other policy-making bodies of Congress, their participation in Congress activities, and their responsibilities with regard to the implementation of Congress policies.

For that purpose, a special committee, under my chairmanship, was appointed to study the problem and to report to the Administrative Committee at its next meeting on June 3rd.

I am writing to ask you, as an organization which has in the past been affiliated with the Congress, to appoint a special committee to meet with our committee to discuss this problem. I hope that this meeting can be arranged to take place within the next week.
