Received your letter of April 22nd and thank you for your nice and kind words. I can tell you only that the little things I am doing are because I feel this is my duty to the family of the person who made such a great contribution to Jewish life. I only wish that I could do more.

I want to tell you that I am determined to see that the IKUF should intensify its work for the publication of the late Dr. Zhitlowsky's works. I am not satisfied that the work developed so that only the third volume is at the printers. Of course you must realize that there is a lot of money involved. Every book published these days costs a minimum of \$3,000 and that until they dispose of the first volumes it will be hard for them to publish the next. However I am going to do my best in this direction.

I talked to Weinger and he made me a definite promise that the check would be mailed out to you immediately. I hope that you received it already. If not, just inform me and I will see that you receive it.
